Please note that this process is only for the first week of school ending on Friday, 19 January. (Gr R and Gr 1 parents have been informed of the drop-off and pick-up procedures for these grades.)

Drop-off and pick-up of learners from Monday, 22 January 2024



School will start at 07h25 and we will have morning line-up for the learners once the bell rings at the start of the day. The Grade 1-3 learners will line up outside the Grade 1 and 2 classrooms, the Grade 4-6 learners will line up at the flagpole area and the Grade 7 learners will line up in the Grade 7 Quad. Parents who accompanied their children for the drop-off will then be expected to make their way out of the school premises once the bell rings. (Teachers will practice this procedure tomorrow to ensure learners know where to go for line-up)

The Grade 4 to 7 learners will be allowed to leave the classes at the end of the day to be collected/to meet their parents. The Grade R – 3 learners will have to be fetched from their classes/area. After 13h50 all learners will be placed in the School Waiting Area to be fetched by their parents. We are concerned that in the past we have noted that some learners were constantly fetched late in the afternoon. We do have an Aftercare Facility (details provided below) on the school premises where your child can be under supervised care if you are not able to fetch them on time. No child should be left to sit in our Waiting Area for hours on end.

Parent Info Evening and Bring & Braai

Please diarise Thursday 01 February, as Bryneven will be hosting our annual Parent Information Evening and Bring & Braai function. Important information will be shared by the various grades during the sessions so please make sure you attend and then join us for the bring & braai afterwards. Further details will be given closer to the time.

School Uniform

All children must wear the correct summer school uniform from the beginning of the term. The different pieces of clothing can be viewed on the official Bryneven Website page. Please note that class teachers will be holding periodic inspections of

uniforms and hair. The co-operation of all parents will be appreciated. The new school uniform includes the football shirt which will be used for cricket as well as a number of additional sports. Please refer to the D6 Communicator for pictures of the sports kits. The old blue and yellow striped jersey will not be allowed for school matches but can be used for practice

sessions. Highlights or the use of different colours in the hair is not allowed. Girls and boys need to have their hair done neatly and if their hair passes their collar, it should be neatly tied. Fingernails must be cut neatly, and the use of the

correct socks and shoes is essential in maintaining a neat appearance. Please refer to the school's uniform policy for specific requirements.

As mentioned at the AGM last year, children in the Inter-Sen Phase are encouraged to wear the official school blazer, especially if they are representing Bryneven at Inter-School matches. The use of the official school tracksuit on Fridays will continue for the foreseeable future unless there is a Civvies Day which will take precedence. Learners can wear their house T-shirts when using the school tracksuits which can be worn with takkies. The use of tracksuits, other than those permitted days, is not allowed. If a learner does not have the official school tracksuit, then the normal summer or winter uniform must be worn.

Last year it was impressive to see the number of children who wore their school blazer. It really made our learners look smart as it helps to complete the look of the school uniform. We are encouraging all the Grade 4 to 7 learners especially, to wear the school blazer during the course of the week.

Only the learners in the Foundation Phase (Grades 1 to 3) will still be allowed to come to school in their PE kits/official school tracksuits only on the days when they have PE. All learners who are participating in Extra-mural activities after school must change into their proper kit before the session. Ample time is provided for changing. Parents are encouraged to ensure that their child's clothing items are labelled so,







in the event that it is lost/misplaced, then it can be easily identified in the Lost Property room near the Bantry Road entrance. Grade 4 to 7 learners need to come dressed in their school uniforms on PE days and will be given enough time to change into their PE kits before PE lessons.

Extra-Murals

Although the full Term 1 Extra-mural programme will only commence from Monday, 29 January, coaches will be notifying learners about certain sessions during the next couple of days. Our school's extra-mural programme for Term 1 will be issued as soon as all our sports fixture lists have been received and confirmed. This week, the focus will be on general orientation and Inter-house swimming trials. Selection trials for the U/8 to Open cricket league teams will take place next week.



NB: U/12 and U13 cricket age groups form the Open team.

Junior cricket teams (Gr 1 and Gr 2): More specific information about our cricket for all our younger teams will be issued in due course.

Inter-house swimming gala trials – Please note that the annual Inter-house swimming gala will be taking place on Friday, 26 January, weather permitting! Specific details will be sent out in due course. <u>NB:</u> <u>Swimming trials for the House teams will start on Thursday morning, 18 January, during school time.</u> Note:

All learners in the Under 8, Under 9 and Under 10 age groups must bring along their swimming costumes, caps and towels (Thursday 18, January). The Junior Individual Medley for the Under 10 age group only will also take place on Thursday, 18 January. On Friday, 19 January, we will be continuing with the Under 11, Under 12 and Open swimmers. The Individual Medley for the Under 11, 12 and Open age groups will

take place on Friday, 19 January. The best times in the Divisions will be taken into account.



Please bear in mind that both Thursday and Friday this week are normal teaching days so children must also bring their school bags and books along as per our Grade 4 to 7 *Orientation timetable*.

Just a reminder to all parents to please ensure that their children wear suitable sun block and hats at all times especially when doing any sporting activities.

Bryneven hats are recommended for Grade 1 – 3 learners during break and sport. Learners are encouraged to carry a bottle of water to stay hydrated during the high temperatures which is expected during this time of the year.

Communication channels

For the benefit of our new families in particular, we would like to explain our communication procedure at Bryneven:

• **Interviews:** At our school we believe that education is not the sole prerogative of the teaching staff but must include the parents, our partners in education. However, although it is the policy of this school to obtain the full co-operation of parents in matters affecting the educational progress of the children, we request that parents <u>do not</u> visit the classroom to consult with a teacher **during school** hours without a prior appointment having been made. *For security reasons we cannot have visitors to*

the school wandering around without having reported to Reception. (It is also not acceptable to keep other children waiting at extra-mural activities because a member of staff has had an unexpected visitor). Appointments for interviews with teachers should be made at least 24 hours before the interview via Reception. Parents are encouraged to discuss their child's progress with the teachers; however, appointments must be made. Should it be necessary, we may request parents to attend an interview to discuss a learner's performance. (At our school, all senior staff, including the Headmaster, teach and they are involved with extra-murals in addition to their administrative duties. Staff are also required to attend GDE courses and meetings). We sincerely hope that contact with the school will not only take place when problems are being experienced.

- **The first line of communication**: While our school has always operated with an 'open door' communication policy for parents and learners, we do encourage parents whenever possible to consult with the class/subject teacher as the first line of communication.
- **Guidance:** Personal or problems of a domestic nature could be referred to the class teacher or the Senior member of staff in charge of the Grade if preferred or to Miss Govender who is in charge of the School-based Support Team.
- **Extra-murals:** Specific extra-mural queries should be addressed with the particular educator or coach involved with the sport *(see Extra-mural Programme)*. Mr Naicker is our extra-mural co-ordinator.
- **Senior Staff:** Parents are also welcome to contact the Grade Head/Co-ordinator or one of the Senior Members of Staff, i.e. the Department Head or the Deputy Head otherwise an appointment should be made to see the Headmaster (once the various channels have been followed).
- **Newsletter & Reply Slips:** All parents listed as the primary contacts on the mailing lists on the school's database will receive a newsletter which is usually sent every second Monday. Please make sure you receive this important communication. The Extra-mural Programme and a list of sports fixtures is given out every term. We urge parents to assist us in our communication by returning reply slips, circulars, questionnaires, etc., timeously.
- **Up-to-date details please notify the school:** Please provide us with relevant up-to-date information regarding your child's progress, health and any other special needs. Please notify us via the class teacher of any change of address or telephone numbers at home or work as soon as possible to enable us to be able to contact you.
- Absence from school: If your child has been absent from school, an explanatory note must accompany him/her on the return to school. A doctor's letter is required if your child is ill on an assessment day (Grade 4 to 7).
- **Queries about School Fees, etc:** All queries about school fees, etc should be directed to Mrs S Leahy or Mrs L Le Roux in the Bryneven Finance Office at Reception. Please submit all monies in a sealed envelope with your child's name, surname, class and state clearly what the money is for. Please remind your child to hand the envelope in by 08:00.
- **EdAdmin:** Previously we made use of the Edupac operating system to host Bryneven's Report Portal and serve as part of our communication network. However, we have identified a new communication system which will eliminate the need of the variety of existing channels and make our communication to and from much simpler. The new system is known as EdAdmin and will be implemented during the course of this term. What makes EdAdmin so exciting is that it is an App-based system so all information will be available on your smartphone/device and will also offer the ability to simplify other areas of communication (such as permission for sporting events, contact information etc). The first term report cards will be hosted on the EdAdmin system and all parents will be expected to sign on to access the benefits of the new system. Further information will be provided in due course.

Tuckshop – Café Flava

The school tuckshop is operated by Café Flava who have all their menu items designed by a certified Chef. This enables your child to get wonderfully nutritious meals which taste just as good. They also have an online ordering system. To get

Bryneven School Lockers
